hat a wonderful year we had pursuing our mission to train leaders, serve community and change lives! We joined the Association of Junior Leagues International (AJLI) in exploring solutions to three key issues facing Leagues around the

world: The need to increase membership numbers, strengthen community impact and lessen burnout among leaders. For the past three years, the JLC has been actively participating in the AJLI's Action Learning Teams. In recognition of our contributions to seeking innovative solutions to these universal challenges, AJLI presented the JLC with an award honoring our "Commitment to securing the future of the Junior League Movement."

At a local level, we addressed the need to increase membership numbers in a variety of ways, including by launching an important pilot program: JLConnect. A mentoring program, JLConnect provided members the opportunity for meaningful, small-group format engagement with fellow members and experienced leaders. In a year-end survey, 100% of participants said that they would recommend JLConnect to a friend.

The JLC also made great strides in to strengthen our impact in the community. More than 100 volunteers worked side-by-side to build a playground for the Chicago Preschool Academy in Chicago's Chatham neighborhood, a community with which the JLC did not have an existing relationship. Like all of our outstanding community projects, this project exemplifies our focus on healthy lifestyles.

To address the concern of burnout among leaders, we launched an advanced leadership training program: Get On Boards. Led by experts in nonprofit management, the two-day course educated aspiring leaders about best practices for effective board service and offered tips for how to get on boards of directors in our community.

Effectively addressing the high-level issues as outlined by AJLI requires the dedication of every member. Among the members who made a big difference in the life of the JLC this past year were the leaders who served on our 2013-2014 Board of Directors and Management Committee. The generous contribution of time and expertise from these women was remarkable, as was the extraordinary leadership of Executive Vice President Chrissie Bonaguidi Russell. We were also delighted to end our year with a full complement of colleagues on our administrative staff team, led by Operations Director Mary Ann Lillie. I am deeply grateful to all of the leaders, members, staff, family and friends who make up the Junior League of Chicago. It is your passion and commitment that brings our mission to life every day.

hroughout the 2013 – 2014 fiscal year, the Junior League of Chicago continued to employ its many resources to serve and educate the Chicago community. Guided by our mission to train leaders, serve community, and change lives, the JLC deployed over \$200,000 in support of our programming, including thirteen community projects and a wide range of training opportunities for our members. We continued to reinforce our long-term commitment to our mission by designating additional funds to our Community Project Development Fund. We also designated significant funds to our Headquarters Fund, which has

allowed us to enhance our infrastructure through the implementation of the Digital Cheetah volunteer software solution, allowing our members better access to the tools they need to serve the community. 



Mentor Program, ULConnect

The JLC can be a daunting organization. To a newcomer, it can appear that everyone knows everyone. We needed to help women foster connections within our organization. So during the 2013 year, we launched JLConnect, a mentor program. JLConnect matches women within the JLC with more veteran, active members.
